DRESS CODE:

Heavy jackets and coats are generally designed for outside wear and should not be worn in the classroom. Plain or BCS sweatshirts and BCS sweater/jackets may be worn, but hoods must remain down.

STUDENT TRANSPORTATION POLICY

Any student desiring to ride with another student driver (that is not of the same family) to or from school activities must have a permission slip signed by **both** sets of parents on file in the school office. Permission slips must be submitted annually. This policy is for insurance purposes and for the protection of the students.



STUDENT PARENT PICK-UP

If there is a change in your child's usual transportation, please be sure you **send in a note** so that we will know that you have given your permission for this change.

AFTERNOON DISMISSAL

Students not riding buses will be dismissed at 2:30 p.m. Students riding buses will be dismissed at specific times for bus departure. Those children not riding buses need to be picked up no later than **2:45 p.m.!** Also, if you must pick up your child early, please notify the office **in writing** that morning and then come to the school office, **not** the classroom, when picking up your child during the school day.

DRESS CODE: As you shop for clothes for your children, note the following:

BOYS:

- ◆ May wear either casual or dress slacks. However, blue jeans, painter pants, camouflage pants and other faddish styles of slacks are not to be worn. Pants must be hemmed.
- ◆ May wear any shirt with a collar and at least two buttons or a zipper (zippers must be kept "up to the neck") except those with advertising logos or slogans printed on them. T-shirts are not acceptable for classroom wear. Shirts must be properly buttoned (only top button open) and kept tucked inside the trousers. Turtleneck shirts are permitted with or without a sweater. French collars are permitted, Henley collars are not. Shirtsleeves must be hemmed.
- ◆ Footwear:
 Dress, casual, or athletic shoes with non-marking soles are required.
- ◆ Socks must be worn with all footwear.

GIRLS:

- ◆ May wear skirts and blouses or dresses. Hemlines and any slits must be no higher than the top of the knee (2 inches above the floor when kneeling). Skirts must be hemmed and may not have holes or faded markings.
- ◆ Blouses and dresses must be modest. Necklines should not be revealing. Blouses should be buttoned properly (top button may be left open). Sundresses and dresses with spaghetti straps are permissible only if they are worn with a non-see-through jacket or over a blouse. Sleeveless blouses are acceptable, but tank tops are not appropriate classroom attire.
- ◆ Shirts with advertising logos or slogans printed on them are not acceptable for classroom.
- ◆ Girl's Footwear:
 Dress, casual, or athletic shoes with non-marking soles are required.
- ◆ Shorts, culottes, or capris are not to be worn as classroom attire.
- ◆ Parents and students should be careful to avoid clothing that would be too revealing or tight fitting for girls.
- ◆ Girls may wear dress slacks as normal classroom attire. **Dress slacks must not resemble jeans and will come to the top of the shoe.** Fad styles of any type like tight knit stretch pants, leggings, jeggings, yoga pants, etc. are not appropriate classroom or school attire. They are to be clean, hemmed, with no holes, rips, tears, or frays. They are to be modest, properly fitted (not too tight or too loose) and properly worn (as designed). Garments that are stretched, stained, or extremely faded are not appropriate. Advertising logos or slogans printed on them are also not acceptable for school attire.

Please note that no flip-flops, athletic sandals/slides or shower shoes are to be worn during the school class day. Athletic sandals/slides are permitted for BCS sports-related events for participating athletes only.

SUPPLY LIST

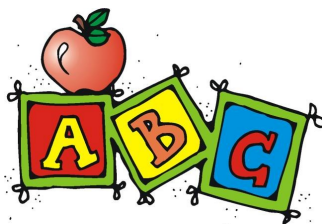
Pre-Kdg & Kindergarten..Book bag large enough to fit folder & lunch box, 2 folders, pencil box, CRAYOLA crayons, pencils, cap erasers, scissors and glue sticks. Please label all items. The following items can be sent in for classroom use - tissues, hand sanitizer, and disinfecting wipes.

Grades 1 & 2...King James Bible, 3 folders, ruler, pencil box, crayons, pencils, big eraser, glue sticks, colored pencils, scissors, tissues, and hand sanitizer. The following item can be sent in for classroom use - and disinfecting wipes.

Grades 3 & 4...King James Bible, 3-ring loose-leaf notebook & 8 dividers, **wide ruled** notebook paper, pencils, erasers, colored pencils, crayons, ruler, scissors, black dry erase markers, tissues. The following items can be sent in for classroom use - hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes.

Grades 5 & 6...King James Bible, assignment planner, 8 single subject spiral bound notebooks—**wide ruled only!**, **wide ruled** loose leaf notebook paper, green ink colored pens, colored pencils **and** markers, erasable blue or black pens, pencils, erasers, box of tissues, and a journal of some kind (it can be a composition notebook or fancy bound journal). The following items can be sent in for classroom use - hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes.

Grades 7-12...King James Bible, assignment planner with pre-printed dates, large 3 ring notebook with separate sections, pencils, pens, highlighters, correction fluid. Eighth grade needs a basic calculator. Poster board will be required for various projects throughout the year for a number of classes (does not need to be purchased before the beginning of school). The following items can be sent in for classroom use - tissues, hand sanitizer, and disinfecting wipes.



ARE YOUR CHILD'S HEALTH RECORDS UP TO DATE?



A **physical exam** is required prior to entrance to kindergarten and in the sixth and eleventh grades. For sixth and eleventh grade the exam may be done anytime four months prior to the start of the grade until the end of that grade. A physical form is available in the school office. If an older student has a sports physical done that would be acceptable.

A **dental exam** is required prior to entrance to kindergarten and in the third and seventh grades. A Family Dentistry Form is available in the school office.



Kindergarten students need to have a copy of their immunization record at school prior to the first day of school.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION ATTIRE is as follows:

- All students in grades K4-12 are required to wear a uniform for Physical Education classes.
 - ◆ For **grades K4-6** this uniform is a pair of pants or shorts (as noted below) with any **solid** color T-shirt or a BCS logo T-shirt, socks, and sneakers. They may wear this all day.
 - ◆ For **grades 7-12** this uniform is a pair of sweat pants or shorts (as noted below), any **solid** color T-shirt or a BCS logo T-shirt, socks, and sneakers.
- Shorts that meet the guidelines for sport practices may be worn, but sweat/warm-up pants must be worn when leaving school. Practice shorts must have an 8" inseam or be 2 inches above the knee when kneeling.
- **Elementary** students may wear shorts (as described above), but sweat pants must be worn over top. The students will be allowed to remove their sweat pants and put them back on at the start and finish to P.E.
- **Jr. and Sr. High Students** will come to school wearing normal dress code and change into their Physical Education uniform before P.E. Class. Those wearing shorts (as described above) must put sweat/warm-up pants on at the end of P.E.
